INDUSTRIES DEPARTMENT GOVERNMENT OF ODISHA

INTRODUCTION

The key focus of the Industries Department is to enable industrial growth in diversified sectors. During this trying year impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department's focus has been on providing assistance to the industries in the State with regards to movement of labour, support in logistics, supply chain management for raw materials and transportation of finished goods to ensure that the industries resume operating at pre-COVID levels as soon as possible. The Department has been able to ensure this quite successfully across the State.

Another major function of the Department is to undertake investment promotion initiatives. In this regard, various proactive initiatives were taken up to attract new investments in the identified focus sectors through various webinars with the global investor community. During the year, officials of the Department held discussions with institutions and industries from Japan, Republic of Korea, USA and Vietnam to showcase the business ecosystem and investment opportunities in the State. These interactions will lead to further deepening of engagement with these countries once the economy opens up post COVID-19.

The Department also supported all concerned Departments in successfully completing the implementation and submission of the reforms under State Reform Action Plan (SRAP) – 2020 as recommended by DPIIT, Government of India. As part of this exercise, the Department coordinated with 18 State Government departments and agencies to ensure implementation of the recommended reform action points in key reform areas including investment enablers, single window system, labour reform enablers, sectoral reforms, public procurement, commercial dispute resolution enablers etc. The Department also undertook the integration of additional 9 services covering 5 Departments with the State Single Window System GO SWIFT ensuring comprehensive facilitation support for the industries.

Prior, to this the Department also successfully anchored implementation of District Reforms Action Plan along with additional reforms related to central inspection system and renewal permissions elimination across multiple departments. This enabled the state to receive additional borrowing permission of Rs. 1,429 crore from the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Government of India. The Department is now supporting concerned State Government Departments in the implementation of regulatory burden reduction exercise to enable a hassle-free and prompt doing business environment for all industries.

Even during these difficult economic scenario, the Industries Department has been able to attract new investments across multiple sectors. Since, the pandemic began the Department has facilitated projects with investment size of over INR 1 lakh crore for approval to the State Level Single Window Clearance Authority. The State has been focusing on grounding these projects in diversified sectors such as petrochemicals, food processing, healthcare, renewable energy and IT. The Department also organised 3 phases of groundbreaking and inauguration events during the year to ensure that the projects are grounded and implemented at a fast pace.

The Department is also working towards further value addition in major industrial regions such as Angul and Jharsuguda for aluminium downstream and Kalinganagar for steel downstream. Further, Paradeep is being developed as the hub of for chemicals and petrochemicals industries. During the year, the proposal from the State for the Odisha Economic Corridor has received approval from NICDIT for further development. The Department also initiated the DPR preparation for Biju Expressway and is expected to be completed by Apr 2021. The Department has also proposed to setup new state-of-the-art parks for food processing, technical textiles and bulk drug manufacturing at strategic locations.

To further give impetus to these initiatives, the Department, with support from other Departments, will be organizing 3rd edition of the Make in Odisha Conclave in 2021 and also release a new Industrial Policy for the State. With these developments, Odisha is poised to become an investment destination of choice for industries not only India but from across the world.

- Under Programme Expenditure, 18 no.of Schemes have been proposed for the Financial Year 2020-21 including 8 new schemes i.e. (a) Financial assistance under Industrial Policy Resolutions (IPRs), (b) Grants to Odisha Investment Export Promotion Office (OIEPO), (c) Financial Assistance to meet contractual obligations for payment of water charges to M/s MEIL, (d) Financial assistance for development of Industrial Clusters, (e) Financial assistance for development of Metal Downstream Parks, (f) Financial Assistance for project Development Expenditure of PCPIR at Paradeep, (g) Financial Assistance to IDCOL for execution of extended Lease Deed for Tailangi A and B chromite mines and (h) Grants for setting up of Convention-cum-Trade Zone.
- Under Programme Expenditure an amount of Rs.54445.00 lakh has been provided in the BE for 2020-21 which includes an amount of Rs.149.13 lakh towards salaries and administrative cost of 4 Nos. of Special Land Acquisition Cells.

Under Administrative Expenditure, an amount of Rs.554.60 lakh has been provided in the BE-2020-21 which includes an amount of Rs.28.00 lakh towards Establishment & Strengthening of Odisha Investment and Export Promotion Centre located in the Office of Resident Commissioner, New Delhi(OIEPO).

As a result such relentless efforts from the IPICOL, Invest Odisha have been categorized as a **top performer** among 20 state investment promotion agencies with an overall score of 98 per cent. The assessment by Invest India in collaboration with the World Bank Group was meant to

measure the preparedness of Indian investment promotion agencies to attract and facilitate investment projects.

The Government is committed in bringing ease to regulatory compliance for businesses. It has started an ambitious program for reforms to make it easier, simpler and quicker for businesses to operate. These reforms cover the entire lifecycle of the business and aim at reducing compliance burden on industry significantly. IPICOL has been appointed as the nodal agency for facilitating other departments in implementing the reforms in the state. As a result Odisha has become the 7th State in the country to avail an additional borrowing of 0.25% of GSDP, as the State has successfully implemented District Level Business Action Reform Plan alongwith other 6 states, announced by the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Government of India.

To achieve the mandate of IPICOL, Invest Odisha and various agencies/ consultants were engaged and professional services from them were rendered from them. Detail of the agencies and their Scope are below:

1. Investment Promotion Advisory Services for Focus Sectors

The thrust of the Government is on environmentally suitable industrialization, which generates maximum employment opportunity and augments State revenue. To achieve this goal, M/s PricewaterhouseCoopers was engaged as the Investment Promotion Advisors for the Focus Sectors. The main objectives of the assignment includes, promotion of Industrial investments into the State through focused Activities in the identified focus sectors and sub-sectors, interact with potential investors, assist in grounding of investment proposals and act as an Investment Advisor to IPICOL. The agency also acts as the knowledge partner in formulating policies and making strategies for attracting investment. In addition to this the agency also provide support for

- Assist in development of investment promotion strategy and action plan and their updating from time-to-time.
- ii. Assist in development of various marketing collaterals and presentations for promoting Odisha as an investment destination.
- iii. Assist in reaching out to prospective investors to attract investments into the investment regions and industrial clusters being set up by the State.
- iv. Provide assistance to IPICOL in investor follow-up activities and develop & maintain a dashboard to monitor progress of the investor contact program.

v. Assist IPICOL in organizing investor meets, road shows (national & international), sectoral seminars and participation in other identified national and international events.

2. PR and Social Media Activities

IPICOL in support with Industries Department is promoting the Odisha as the preferred investment destination. As part of Investment Promotion activity, IPICOL engaged Concept Communication as the PR & Social media partner of Invest Odisha. The following activities were carried out by IPICOL during the period.

- i. Organizing Press conferences & interviews of senior journalist,
- ii. Disseminate and release news articles on behalf of the Government,
- iii. Coverage in national newspapers business websites + vernacular dailies,
- iv. Managing Social media platforms and execute campaign in digital platform,
- V. Ensure proper visibility and promotion through print, electronic and social media.

3. Creative Agency

To strengthen the "Brand Odisha" IPICOL engaged M/s Lintas India Pvt. Ltd as the creative agency for preparing various promotional materials. The agency provides the creative / videos in line with the brand manual for promotional use in the print, television, online, outdoor and social media platforms. These creative gave an identity to the state in terms of the preferred investment destination and gateway to the ASEAN region.

Ease of doing business

To ensure a hassle-free business environment to investors, a number of reforms along with a number of technological interventions have been carried out by various Departments of the State Government in the recent past. As a part of ease of doing business in the State, the following technological platform have been developed.

a) GO-SWIFT:

The flagship portal of Industries Department i.e. "GOSWIFT", developed & maintained by IPICOL has received more than 1700 PEAL applications till date; across diversified sectors for immediate implementation throughout the state. Similarly more than 14000 Service applications pertaining to different Govt. Departments like DoWR, Dept. of Forest & Environment, Dept. of Labour & ESI, OSPCB, Dept. of Factories & Boilers, Works Dept. etc..

The portal has also received the award from National e-Governance under the purview of Dept. of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances, Government of India in Silver Category.

Further to ramp up new services in GO-SWIFT portal, as per requirement of DPIIT, now IPICOL is, including 7 nos. of additional departmental services and integrating with 8 nos. of departmental services.

b) SLFC

To facilitate ease of doing business in Odisha and expedite the grounding of projects, the State has taken various initiatives such as creation of the State Level Facilitation Cell (SLFC) at IPICOL where senior officials from departments of Energy, Water, OSPCB, Factories & Boilers and IDCO are deputed on a full time basis with delegation of appropriate authority to process industrial approvals. The SLFC, which meets every week, has had 194 meetings till date since its inception in 2015.

Since April, 2020 SLFC has approved/ recommended a total 44 projects worth INR 1,16,561.66 crores with employment potential of about 50,741 nos. and issues pertaining to about 25 industrial projects have been resolved.

c) SLSWCA and HLCA

Since April, 2020 seven (7) meetings of State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLSWCA) have been held to approve project proposals. Thirty four (34) Nos. of project proposals have been cleared by State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLWCA) aggregating proposed investment of Rs. 9,640.23 Crores. Besides ten (10) nos of project proposals have been cleared by three (3) High Level Clearance Authority (HLCA) meetings aggregating proposed investment of Rs.1,06,921.43 Crores.

These proposals are spread across various diverse sectors from Metal & Metal Downstream,
Textiles, Food Processing, Fertilizers, Chemicals, Petroleum & Petrochemicals, Plastics, Logistics &
Infrastructure, Tourism and Manufacturing.

d) Preparation of Benchmarking Report:

Various DIC's/ RIC's & IPICOL are recommending allotment of lands to various types of MSME/ Large units in the State to IDCO through DLSWCA/ SLSWCA. Earlier there was no benchmark report in terms of Investment, Employment, size of land parcel and other infrastructure for allotment of land to the following MSME & Large units.

IPICOL to develop a comprehensive Benchmarking document to validate the assumptions of the various industrial investors in terms of their land demand, requirement for power, water, investments and employment generation. This would assist in informed decision making by IPICOL/DIC and optimal utilization of industrial infrastructure. With this premise, CBRE South Asia Pvt Ltd has been appointed by IPICOL to conduct a detailed benchmarking report for allotment of land, power and water to various categories of business units, including large & MSME units. The agency covered both international as well as national companies in order to have an overall industry perspective and understand the requirements for global as well as foreign investors.

In this regard, it may be noted that there are various good practices being adopted with respect to industrial land planning, development, management and allotment in other States/ Countries. The consulting agency ascertained the good practices adopted elsewhere, that industrial land is used in a most optimal way. It was imperative that a study be conducted to identify, what kind of industry/ industrial segment (MSME as well as larger units) would approximately require what size of land based on other State's/ countries experiences and industry strengths.

CSR framework towards institutionalization of CSR activities in Odisha

A web-portal called Government of Odisha – CSR Administration and Responsive Engagement (GO CARE) was subsequently created to provide all key information on the CSR activities in the State. The portal contains all CSR projects, undertaken, ongoing and upcoming in the State, thereby acting as a one stop shop for all CSR activities in the State. District level and block level HDIs

collected from various welfare department updated in the GOCARE portal for better corporate decision while selecting CSR initiatives.

- 1. For the year 2014-20, 7819 projects of amount 2753.03 Cr has been reported on the GOCARE portal.
- 2. The district authorities and the welfare departments identify projects depending on the specific need in various areas. Based on the development goals and priorities of the State, the CSR Council scrutinizes these projects and recommends high-impact projects for the consideration of corporates to take up as a CSR initiative. More than 1,100such projects have been recommended by the Council.
- 3. Regular dissemination workshops are being conducted to appraise the corporates, district administrations and other stakeholders about the GOCARE portal and help in increased CSR interventions.
- 4. It is expected that with the growth of industrialization in the State, CSR is poised to play a significant role in sustainable development of the local community. The corporates could complement the initiatives of the State Government to create a focused and holistic impact through their CSR initiatives. Specifically, for development in the 'less-reached' districts, it has been proposed that corporates may consider to 'Adopt a Block' in these districts for a minimum period of 3 years and undertake various developmental activities as per the specific requirements of the identified block. The blocks and the activities are uploaded in the portal.

Ground breaking

After the approvals were received, with consistent coordination for land allotment, 12 companies had their groundbreaking/inauguration by the hand of Hon'ble CM, in one phase amounting to grounding of investment of about Rs. 8,797.03 crores and employment potential of about 7,090 nos.

Industry Care during the COVID-19 lockdown

- 1. An Inter-ministerial committee was set up by Hon'ble CM, to prepare an action plan for quick opening up of Large Industries, MSME and Start-ups in the wake of the lockdown imposed due to COVID-19 pandemic. One such meeting of the committee was held to discuss issues with the Industry Associations and Banks.
- 2. Meetings held with the concerned government agencies for expedition of development works of Paradeep Plastic Park, IOCL Textile Park, Angul Aluminium Park.

- 3. Around 8 meetings held with over 40 industries through Video Conferencing to help them tackle labour, transportation and other issues that they are facing during the lockdown, in order to help them get running to fuller capacities.
- 4. Out of the 58 concerns raised by various industries, 34 issues have been resolved with the intervention of the department and close coordination with other Government agencies.
- 5. Issues of industries like TATA Steel, JSL, JSPL, Vedanta, Hindalco, IOCL, ITC, Hindustan Coca-Cola, Inda-Nissin, Page Industries (Jockey), Astral Pipes, Britannia, Parle Agro, Jay Bharat Spices, Falcon, Ruchi Foods and Milk Mantra have been addressed.
- 6. Many Large industries and MSMEs have been successfully made operational again with the active involvement of the department.
- 7. Meanwhile, to get the Industrial eco-system of the state back on track and minimize the impact of the pandemic, 2 nos. of SLFC meetings were held during the lockdown to facilitate the industries and hand hold them.

Other Activities

(a) ISO 9001:2015

The recertification audit for ISO 9001:2015 will be carried out in March'21.

(b) Finance:

Annual report of the Corporation duly attested by the statutory auditor for the Financial Year 2019-20 was completed in October, 2020. The same was audited by the Comptroller and Auditor General of India with no significant audit observations.

Management of Odia Migrant Workers in Gujarat during COVID-19

IPICOL team also served as the nodal agency for the management of migrant workers based in Gujarat. A dedicated 24X7 helpline, manned by IPICOL employees, catered to over 2000 distress calls related to various issues faced (primarily food, shelter and medical exigency) and provided expedited resolution through coordination with the respective District Administrations in Gujarat.

Subsequently, with the resumption of special transportation facility (i.e. Shramik Special trains, buses) for return of Odias from Gujarat to respective native districts in Odisha, the helpdesk further facilitated necessary coordination with the respective District Administration in Gujarat.

5T: Under 5T initiative IPICOL was mandated with the following activities

- 1. Making Odisha amongst top 3 industrialized states, in terms of grounded investment: IPICOL is promoting the State under the brand of Invest Odisha for attracting Investment in to the state. The flagship events like Make in Odisha and other sectoral events were organized to reach out to the investor community. As a result <u>Odisha</u> has edged past <u>Maharashtra</u> as the most attractive destination for investments during Q1 or the April-September period of FY20. Invest Odisha committed to maintain the pole position.
- 2. Ensuring overall socio-economic development through industries with 50% value addition to metal: Odisha is the mineral hub of the country and largest producer of Aluminium, Steel and Stainless Steel in the country. Odisha aims to add value to these base metals by promoting downstream industries in these sectors. A vision document has been prepared which guide the state to achieve 50% value addition to its base metal products by 2030. These downstream industries will generate employment and revenue for the state and will help in socio-economic development of local community.
- 3. Comprehensive end-to-end single-window clearance for industries: The single window clearance system of Odisha (GO SWIFT) is one of the first of its kind in the country and it creates a benchmark for others for adapt. The GO SWIFT was awarded with silver medal at the National e-governance Award for 2019-20 under category-1 ('Excellence in Government Process Reengineering for Digital Transformation'), by the e-Governance division of the Centre. The single window provides 17 services from 10 Departments to the Investors which is a one stop solution for the investors. Integration with many other services is in progress.

TECHNOLOGICAL interventions such as GO SWIFT, GO PLUS, GO SMILE, GO CARE, and Invest Odisha CRM Module were adopted to help the Invest Odisha team work efficiently and facilitate the services to the Investor community. Online service delivery brings TRANSPARENCY and ORTPSA enables the investors to avail the services in prescribed TIME. Through various training program & capacity building workshops the Invest Odisha TEAM is TRANSFORMED itself in to a professional Organization.

The Industrial Development Corporation of Odisha Limited (IDCO)

Odisha Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (IDCO) was set up by the Government of Odisha as a statutory Corporation in 1981. IDCO has been acting as the Nodal Agency for providing industrial infrastructure and land for industrial and infrastructure projects in the State.

The Objective & Functions

The objective of the Corporation is to provide infrastructure services for rapid establishment and orderly growth of industry, trade and commerce in Odisha. Its core functions are broadly as follows:

- Development of industrial estates, industrial areas, IT Parks and other industrial complexes.
- Land Acquisition services for major & mega projects and creation of Land bank.
- Development of Infrastructure facilities and facilitation of private-sector participation
- Project Construction services

Industrial Estates/Parks/Areas

Facilitating industrial investments by way of providing ready-to-use infrastructure is its core business. To this pursuit, a large number of industrial estates/ areas/ Parks, Theme Parks, etc. have been established and managed by the Corporation in different strategic locations of the state. Developed plots and built-up sheds are allotted to entrepreneurs intending to set-up their industrial ventures at attractive rates. Such projects include:

- 117 industrial estates/areas in strategic locations of Odisha with an area of Ac.10906.276
 land and 1545 nos. built up sheds.
- Out of the above land, around Ac.5905.879 land and 1475 nos built up sheds has been allotted to 5833 nos different Industrial Units in different Industrial Estates. During this year (as on 31.12.2020), 111 nos small & medium units have been allotted around Ac. 55.669 of land in different Industrial Estates/Areas.
- IDCO has taken up establishment/development of 07 (seven) Multi-Product MSME Park at Ramdaspur in Cuttack district (Ac.55.63), Chhatabar in Khurda district (Ac.53.35), Talamulasasan in Angul district (Ac.53.02), Basantpur in Sambalpur district (Ac.50.00), Reuna in Sundargarh district (Ac.51.00), Kesinga in Kalahandi district (Ac.62.72) and Barapali, Hinjili in Ganjam district (Ac.31).

Infrastructure projects under implementation:

1. Special Economic Zone (SEZ):

Two SEZs have been developed by IDCO. Infocity SEZ of IDCO at Chandaka (Bhubaneswar) developed over an area of 145.91 acre is in operation. Mind Tree, TCS, WIPRO have established their units in the SEZ. A Sector Specific IT/ITES SEZ is under implementation at Gaudakasipur near Bhubaneswar (Info Valley) over an area of 262 acres of land. M/s Infosys is the anchor tenant for this SEZ which has been allotted Ac.50.909 of land in the Park. The Unit is operational.

2. Electronic Manufacturing Cluster (EMC):

IDCO is developing an electronic hardware manufacturing cluster at Infovalley under the Electronics Manufacturing Cluster (EMC) Scheme of Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. As per the Final Approval accorded by the MeitY vide letter dated 05.09.2016, the above EMC would be established over an area of 203.37 acres of land with Project Cost of Rs. 200,75,18,881/-. MeitY, Government of India will provide Rs.93,08,71,508/- as Grant-in-Aid for the Project. 1st installment of 18.61 Cr already released by Government of India. An SPV namely M/s Odisha Electronics Park Limited has been formed to implement the project. The land has been demarcated & stones fixed. Development works like internal road, boundary wall, land scalping, R&D Centre, Common Facility Building, Flatted Factory Building, Worker's Hostel, Administrative works are in progress.

IDCO has allotted 4(four) nos of plots of land measuring Ac.15.02 to the Units in the park to set up units and one unit is operational and started production. Up to date expenditure is Rs.46.07 Crore till November'2020.

3. Petroleum, Chemical and Petrochemical Investment Region (PCPIR):

Under the PCPIR Scheme of Govt. of India, the State govt. is developing a PCPIR at Paradeep to be set up on 284.15 sq km (70,214 acres) of land spread over Jagatsinghpur and Kendrapara districts. The PCPIR hub is expected to attract investments to the tune of Rs 2.74 lakh crore. Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOCL) is the anchor tenant for the project. Around 3,300 acres of land have been acquired and handed over to IOCL for its 15 million tonne per annum oil refinery with an investment of approximately Rs 30000 Crores. IOCL has also announced implementation of a 700 KT per Annum Polypropylene unit at Paradeep with an investment of Rs 3150 Crores. IDCO has formed an SPV, Paradeep Investment Region

Development Ltd for development required infrastructure for the project. IDCO has undertaken land acquisition of approximately 7400 Acres for industrial development in the PCPIR. The state government, meanwhile, is in the process of identifying new anchor tenants interested in setting up petrochemical cracker units within the PCPIR region.

IOCL has also signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Dhamra Port Company Ltd (DPCL) for a five million tonne per annum (mtpa) LNG (liquefied natural gas) terminal within the port premises at a cost of Rs 5,000 crore. IOCL entered into a MoU with the Odisha Government for development of natural gas infrastructure. The natural gas availability from this terminal is expected to boost downstream industries in the PCPIR region. For preparation of the Master Plan and Zonal Plans for the PCPIR Region, IDCO has already engaged M/s. Feedback Infra Private Limited. The draft Zonal & Master Plan has already been submitted by the Consultant. For preparation of Techno-Economic Feasibility Report and providing Transaction Advisory Services for PCPIR Road Projects (Bhubaneswar-Paradeep alternative highway), IDCO has engaged M/s. Wadia Techno-Engineering Services, Kolkata as Consultancy, which has already been taken over by Works Department. ToR already issued by MoEF, GoI. Final EIA Report has already been prepared and submitted by the consultant M/s EPTRI, Hyderabad. Process for conducting public hearing is initiated after the Covid-19 pandemic.

4. Special Investment Region(SIR) Dhamra:

Based on the development of Dhamra port and upcoming LNG Terminal facility by IOCI at Dhamra, Government is contemplating to develop a Special Investment Region spread over 10000 acres of land in 43 villages and notified it as lease barred area. A special Act has also been prepared. The SIR shall have delineated zone for Industrial, social, logistics, residential etc. It shall create opportunity for manufacturing industries in the Sector of Downstream in Aluminium and Steel, Fertilizer and other Gas based Industries and Wood based Industries etc. IDCO has obtained In-Principle approval for establishment of SIR at Dhamra under Regional Investment Manufacturing Zone Scheme from Department of Economic Affairs of Government India. In the meantime, IDCO has engaged M/s. Price Water House Coopers Limited as Consultant for preparation of Detailed Project Report and necessary studies has been completed. Now the region is considered to be one of the Coastal Economic Zones (CEZ) under Ministry of Shipping, GoI. It is proposed to develop a Bulk Drug Park in the Dhamra

region. A proposal has been submitted to Department of Pharmaceuticals. GoI for consideration.

5. Kalinganagar National Investment Manufacturing Zone

The Steel Complex at Kalinganagar established over an area of 13000 acres of land where 9 Major Steel Companies has already set-up their units and producing 3.5 Million tonnes of steel per annum and has generated 40000 employments. Government of Odisha is planning to develop this complex as National Investment Manufacturing Zone under the National Manufacturing Policy of Government of India. Final approval has already been obtained from Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion, Government of India for establishment of NIMZ at Kalinganagar. IDCO is the Nodal Agency for implantation of the scheme and has engaged M/s feedback Infra Pvt. Ltd as the Consultant to prepare the master plan and detailed project report for the National Investment and Manufacturing Zone (NIMZ) to be developed at Kalinganagar. Govt. of India will provide financial support for trunk infrastructure while internal infrastructure will be developed on a PPP (Public Private Partnership) mode for which access to Viability Gap Funding (VGF) would be provided. Consultant has completed the study and integration with KNDA Master Plan is underway. Request Letter has been sent to GoI for consideration of JCDL as the SPV for the project. Environment Expert, IDCO has been nominated into BoD of JCDL. DIPP has accepted the proposal. Now the new name of SPV is JCD-NIMZ. Draft CMP for Phase I & II completed by the consultant and submitted with KNDA for inviting public objection and suggestions before notification of the area as NIMZ. It is notified. Environmental Consultant engaged for obtaining EC for the NIMZ. M/s JSL has submitted proposal for setting up of a Private Industrial Estate. Final approval granted. Similar proposals submitted from VISA Steel and TATA Steel. Up to date expenditure is 9.23 Crore.

A proposal for setting up of a Steel Cluster over an area of Ac 500 land parcel, has been submitted with Ministry of Steel, Govt. of India for consideration and according In-Principle Approval in going ahead in the region. The Biju Pattnaik National Steel Institute (BPNSI) has been allotted required land parcel to be set up in the region, which shall make the region empowered with availability of skilled manpower.

6. Plastic Park at Paradeep:

To promote industries in Plastic & Polymer sector, a Plastic Park over Ac.120 land is being development in PCPIR at Refinery Complex of IOCL under the Plastic park scheme of Department of Chemicals & Petrochemicals, Government of India with an investment of Rs 106 Crores. Out of the grant of Rs 40 Crores from Govt of India, Govt of India has sanctioned and released Rs 35.80 Crores up to 3rd Installment. Work is taken up by IDCO. Development works for an amount of Rs.107.65 crores are completed to Nov'2020. Administrative Building including all basic infrastructures completed. PPPL has allotted land of Ac.22.62 to 12 nos Units.

Secretary, DCPC inaugurated the Administrative building at CIPET and operating from 01.11.2019

Tender Awarded for STP, LOA to be issued. Execution to begin soon. Solid Waste Management & Plastic Waste Recycling and Telecommunication to be developed.

State Govt. has approved Share cum Subscription Agreement (SSA) with IOCL and IDCO, having 49% equity to be shared by IOCL and 51% to be shared by IDCO. The SSA to be executed shortly.

7. Seafood Park, Deras:

IDCO is developing a Seafood Park at Deras over an area of 152.78 acres of land. The Project is being developed under the Mega Food Parks Scheme of Ministry of Food Processing Industries (MoFPI), Government of India. The total Project cost as approved by the MoFPI, Government of India was revised to Rs.121.955 Crore out of which MoFPI would provide Grant-in Aid Rs. 50.00 Crore. Total grant received 40.00 crore. Basic Enabling Infrastructure all complete. Non-Core facilities all completed. Core facilities all developed; Plant Machinery installation completed. CETP Foundation work has been completed, procurement of bio reactor materials is under process. Tender awarded for development of PPCs at Kimilo, Srikona and Chhatrapur. Civil work completed in Srikona PPC, P&M and PEB Installation under progress. Geo-technical Investigation and site grading for PPCs at Kimilo and Chhatrapur. IDCO has allotted 18 plots to 11 entrepreneurs measuring Ac. 37.60. One unit operational, 3 units under construction.Up to date expenditure is Rs. 112.72 Crore till 30th Nov 2020.State Govt. also discussing with Marine Products Export Development Authority (MPEDA) for setting

up of Food testing lab in Seafood park. Government in MSME Department has also released Rs. 4.50 Cr. assistance to IDCO under State Food Park scheme.

8. Aluminium Park:

For promotion of investment in downstream & ancillary units in the aluminum sector, Angul Aluminum Park is being developed jointly by IDCO & NALCO over 223 acres of land at Angul in the 1st phase. The project is to be developed under Modified Industrial Infrastructure Up-Gradation Scheme (MIIUS) of Department of Industrial Policy & Promotion (DIPP), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Government of India and received the final approval during August'2015. The approved project cost is Rs. 99.60 crore which includes a Central Grant of Rs.33.44 crores. 1st installment of Govt. of India grant of Rs. 10.32 crore has been released to IDCO. 2nd Installment of Rs. 10.76 crore has also been released to AAPPL. Total grant-inaid received from Govt. of India is Rs. 23.40 crore (including interest earned from GOI grant). In the meantime, more than 50 entrepreneurs have evinced interest to set up their unit in the park. IPICOL and DIC Angul appraising the various applications received for investments in the proposed park. NALCO has conveyed its willingness to supply 50,000 MT Hot Molten Metal to the units of the Aluminium Park. Infrastructure development has been held up due to land dispute which is being sorted out. Due to slow progress his contract was rescinded. Balance work has been awarded to M/s. B. C Bhuyan Construction Pvt. Ltd. with contract price of Rs.38.94 Crore. Construction of Common facility building such as Administrative building, Industrial training, development & skill Development Centre, Hostel complex etc are in progress. Allotment of land has been started. Land acquisition of approach road from NH is completed. Motor-able approach road from NH 42/55 is completed as of now. LOI issued to M/s. Aadya Urja, for electrification/ substation work. Land price for Aluminium Park is fixed at Rs.50Lakhs/Ac. Allotment of land to 7 entrepreneurs of Ac. 74.11 have been made so far. The alignment of molten metal corridor from NALCO smelter to Aluminium Park has been jointly approved by NALCO and IDCO. External water supply from CPP reservoir of NALCO to Aluminium Park alignment has been approved by NALCO. Work awarded for external water supply, internal distribution line and UGR for Aluminium Park. Up to date expenditure is Rs. 40.82 Crore till 30th Nov 2020. State Govt. also discussing with Ministry of Mines to establish extension centre of Jawaharlal Nehru Aluminium Research Development and Design Centre (JNARDDC) at Angul Aluminium Park.

9. Agro Industrial Estate:

Department of Agriculture & Farmer's Empowerment, Govt. of Odisha is establishing an Agro Industrial Estate in Semela village under Papadahandi block of Nawarangapur district through IDCO with a project cost of Rs. 12.76 crore. The Industrial Estate is being implemented over an area of 69.81 acres and development of infrastructures like approach road, drain & CD work, power supply & water supply works completed. Deptt. of Agriculture has sanctioned Rs. 6.62 crore to take up these works out of which expenditure has been incurred for Rs.336.83 lakh. A proposal has been submitted to the Department of Agriculture & Farmer's Empowerment, Govt. of Odisha to take up the additional work like widening of approach road along with land scapping & plantation etc.

10. Construction of IT Incubation Centre:

An IT Incubation Centre is being developed in the Infocity IT/ITES SEZ, Chandaka, Bhubaneswar over an area of 2.39 acres of land with a built up area 33048sqm. This complex will have two Towers with a 200 seated IT incubator, built up space for IT/ITES companies, a commercial complex and other amenities. Export oriented software companies can take the advantage of such facility to start their operation prior to moving to their regular development centre. SSI IT / ITES units having export order can move to this location for their immediate operation. Construction of the 1st Tower is in progress. G.F. slab completed. For balance work up to 13th floor, has been awarded to M/s B C Bhuyan Construction (P) Ltd. for an amount of Rs.75.93 Crore and work is in progress.

11. Construction of Office-cum-Commercial Complexes in different districts:

IDCO has taken initiative to construct Office-cum-Commercial Complexes in different districts of the state to attract Corporate Houses to open up their business activities there. In the first phase, construction of Commercial Towers at Dhenkanal & Jharsuguda has been taken up. Work in completion stage at Dhenkanal and completed up to 3rd floor at Jharsuguda.

12. Development of National Waterways (NW)-5

For developing an Inland Navigation System for movement of Cargo from the industries and mines to the ports, a MoU has been signed between Government of Odisha, Inland Waterways Authority of India (IWAI), Paradeep Port Trust and Dhamra Port for the stretch between Talcher to Paradeep and Dhamra of National Waterways (NW)-5. IDCO, on

behalf of State Government, shall spearhead the SPV for developing permanent terminal facilities for bulk cargo handling at Jokadia/Pankpal and other locations. In the meantime, an SPV namely Inland Water Ways Consortium Odisha Limited has been formed, where IDCO is a member along with PPT and DPCL.

13. Textile Park at Dhamnagar

IDCO has contemplated to establish a Textile Park and a Food Park over 234 acres of land available near Dhamnagar in Bhadrak district. The Textile Park shall be developed over 110 acres of land for which M/s IL&FS has prepared a DPR and submitted to Ministry of Textiles, Government of India for sanction under the scheme Integrated Textile Park (SITP). Ac.58.625 of land allotted to IOCL for setting up of manufacturing unit of Textile park.

Construction work:

IDCO also provides comprehensive project construction and management services for execution of civil, electrical and public health engineering projects in social sectors. Over the years, it has successfully executed Civil, Public Health Engineering and Electrical Engineering works entrusted by Government Department, PSUs and Govt. of India. Some of the major works executed by IDCO during the last five years both completed and ongoing are as follows:

Land Acquisition:

IDCO is the nodal agency for acquiring and providing land to large Industries coming up in the State. Large-scale land acquisition is going on at strategic locations for establishment of medium/large projects. During the year, over an area Ac.36.620 of land has been acquired & allotted to both existing & up – coming MOU / NON- MOU projects. So far, over Ac.67913.376 land has been allotted to both MOU/Non-MOU Industries in the state. The allottees include projects under Steel, Aluminum, Ferro Alloys, Cement, Power sectors etc.

Land Bank Scheme

To attract investments in industrial projects and ensure growth of industries in Odisha, ready availability of suitable land is critical. IDCO is the Nodal Agency for creation of "Land Bank" and allotment of such land for Industrial and infrastructure projects including those needed for creating social infrastructure in designated Industrial Estate, Industrial Areas, Industrial Parks & Growth Centers etc. Under the Land Bank scheme, IDCO has identified Ac. 2,21,339.765 of land covering 30 districts and requisition filed so far for alienation/acquisition with district authorities is Ac. 160244.078. Out of which, during the year(as on 31.12.2020) requisition filled for an area of Ac. 1111.529 & an area of Ac.513.797 land has been sanctioned in favour of IDCO under Category – A of the land bank scheme.

Financial achievement:

The turnover achieved by the Corporation is Rs.191.60 crore (Provisional) during 2020-21 as on 31.12.2020 against the MOU target of Rs. 319 crore for 2020 – 21.

THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION OF ODISHA LTD. (IDCOL)

The Industrial Development Corporation of Odisha Limited (IDCOL) was a flagship corporation of Government of Odisha set up in 1962 to promote, establish and manage Industries for revolutionising the industrialization of the State and creating employment opportunities.

In order to give value addition to the abundant mineral resources of the State, IDCOL started its long journey in successfully establishing new industrial units of its own and in association with private entrepreneurs all over the State producing different products such as cement, rerolled products, ferro-alloys, pig iron, cast iron pipes, transmission line towers, aluminum cables, cotton and jute yarn, fasteners, chemicals, salt, fabrication and engineering, mining and software etc., thus providing employment to about 10,000 direct and another 10,000 indirect employees and substantially contributing to the State exchequer.

1962-1990 (pre-liberalization period)

During this period, IDCOL set up major industrial undertakings as its directly managed units and some undertakings as joint venture companies in association with private management.

1991-2006 (post liberalization period)

All directly managed units were converted into subsidiary companies and some joint venture companies were acquired by IDCOL from the private management and made subsidiary companies thus bringing them into direct management of IDCOL.

Keeping its pace with the change of time, IDCOL has taken measures on a regular basis for restructuring its man power and business to consolidate its activities.

IDCOL has unlocked the value of assets of its subsidiary companies and has been able to clear all its external borrowings from Banks and Financial Institutions.

Present Status

The Corporation is continuing with the following activities:

- IDCOL Kalinga Iron Works Ltd. (IKIWL) at Barbil (Foundry Grade Pig Iron and Cast Iron Spun Pipe (100% Subsidiary Company).
- 2. IDCOL Ferro Chrome & Alloys Ltd. (IFCAL) at Jajpur Road engaged in production of High Carbon Ferro Chrome (HCFC).(100% Subsidiary Company)
- 3. IDCOL Software Ltd.(ISL) at Bhubaneswar acts as one of the Nodal IT Agent of the Government of Odisha (IDCOL's Stake 60% (J/V with OSEDC Ltd.)
- 4. Konark Jute Ltd. (KJL)at Dhanmandal (jute products) is under divestment pending before Hon'ble High Court of Odisha. (IDCOL's stake around 70%).

- 5. Talangi Chromite Mines.
- 6. Roida- Iron Ore Mines
- 7. Ampavali Limestone Mines (under operation for Toshali Cement Private Limited)
- 8. IREL IDCOL Limited (A Joint venture company with IREL (India) Ltd.

As the operation of IKIWL was uneconomic due to non-availability of suitable grade. Iron Ore from the Roida 'C' Mines, small size furnace, high cost of production and decline in selling price of Pig Iron, it's operation has been stopped since 1st March,2015. Restructuring of IKIWL is under process.

Due to sluggish market and non-availability of Chrome Ore from Talangi Chromite Mines, the production in IFCAL was stopped from 01.06.2019. After transporting ore from Mines, Furnace operation has been started with effect from 03.12.2019. Again the operation was stopped which has been restarted from November, 2020.

ISL appointed as Nodal Agency is executing various IT activities of the Govt. Departments, agencies and PSUs. It is endeavoring to widen its activities for which it has empanelled new Software Firms to undertake different activities of Govt. and Govt. Departments / bodies.

Konarak Jute Limited (KJL) which has stopped its operation since 13.10.2012 is on the verge of being taken over by a private party as per the order of Hon'ble High Court, Orissa.

Operation of Roida 'C' Iron and Mn. Ore Mines is continuing and that of Talangi Chromites mines has been stopped with effect from 11.11.2018 on safety and economic ground.

New Activities

The Corporation has undertaken the following new activities:

A. Beach Sand Project: IDCOL signed a JV agreement with Indian Rare Earths Ltd.(IREL) on 29.11.2017 for development of Beach Sand Project and a JV Company in the name and style of "IREL IDCOL LTD." has been incorporated on 18.01.2018 by IREL & IDCOL in the share holding ratio of 51:49 respectively to do beach sand Mining. Application has been made by the JV Company to the State Govt. for reservation of Beach Sand area along Puri Coast. Finalization of DPR is under process. Further area is being explored to make application for lease.

Government of Odisha have recommended to the Department of Atomic Energy for grant of lease over beach sand area of 852.459 ha in favour of IREL IDCOL Ltd.

Steps have been initiated for engagement of consultant for obtaining necessary clearance from various authorities required for execution of lease.

B. Merchant Mining

Initiative has been taken by the Corporation to undertake merchant mining activities to cater to the need of the Industry both inside and outside the State.

An area of 416.512 ha, situated in village Deojhar No. 1 within the Thakurani Block-A under Barbil tahashil of Champua Sub-division in Keonjhar District has been reserved in favour of IDCOL for undertaking prospecting and Mining to raise and sell ore for catering to the needs of industries inside and outside the State.

C. Technology Development

The Corporation has initiated steps for undertaking modification of equipments at its Ferro chrome plant to improve efficiency of production and also reduce cost. Modification of some equipment is under process.

IFCAL has successfully separated metal value from slag in its Ferro Chrome Plant at Jajpur Road.

Second Jigging plant has been installed to separate metal value from Old Slag.

Roof Tap Solar Plant has been installed at IFCAL which has started generation of power.

As an energy saving measure, IFCAL has undertaken a programme for replacement of some electrical equipment

THE ODISHA FILM DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION LTD. (OFDC)

The Odisha Film Development Corp. Ltd., Cuttack is a promotional agency for the growth and development of film industry in the state. The corporation is functioning since April 1976 and has been implementing different schemes under the plan programme for development of film industry in the state.

1. Construction of New Cinema Houses

a) Loans to the entrepreneurs for construction of cinema halls

This corporation has devised this scheme for extending loan to the entrepreneurs for construction of Janata and Rural cinema halls in the state. Besides, the corporation is extending loan for renovation and remodeling of existing cinema halls.

By the end of 2019-20, the corporation has sanctioned loan of Rs.49.25 lakhs for construction of 52 nos. of new Janata and Rural Cinema Halls. Besides, the corporation has sanctioned Rs.61.48 lakhs to 34 nos. of Cinema Halls for renovation of existing cinema houses.

During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021), the corporation has not sanctioned any amount for construction of any cinema house and renovation of existing cinema houses.

b) Subsidy to Cinema Halls (Refund of E.T.)

In respect of new cinema houses, the amount collected by way of Entertainment Tax excluding surcharge tax on exhibition of advertisements and show tax for first two years after its commissioning were given as subsidy to the concerned cinema halls through the Odisha Film Development Corporation Ltd. as per the rules approved by the State Govt. from time to time.

By end of 2019-20, the corporation had sanctioned Rs.46.64 lakhs towards subsidy to 18 cinema houses.

During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021), the corporation has not sanctioned any amount towards refund of ET.

2. Production of Films in the State.

(a) Term Loan to Producers for Production of Films

The corporation has formulated this scheme with a view to encourage the producers for production of Odia films in the state. By the end of 2019-20, the corporation has sanctioned Rs.456.00 lakhs towards Term Loan in favour of 44 nos. of producers.

During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021), the corporation has not sanctioned any amount to any producer for production of Odia films.

(b) Soft-cum-bridge Loan to Producers for Production of Films

The corporation has formulated this scheme with a view to enable the producers to complete their incomplete Odia films. By the end of 2019-20, the corporation had sanctioned Rs.163.00 lakhs in favour of 102 nos. of producers towards Soft-cum-Bridge Loan.

During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021), the corporation has not sanctioned any amount to any producer for production of Odia film in the state.

(c) Subsidy to Film Producers

With a view to encourage the producers for production of film in the state the corporation has formulated such scheme for extending subsidy to the producers. This scheme has been implemented after due approval of the State Govt. and as envisaged in the IPRs. By the end of the year 2019-20, the corporation has sanctioned subsidy amounting to Rs.468.86 lakhs in favour of 318 nos. of Producers for production of films.

During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021), the corporation has not sanctioned any amount towards subsidy to any producer for production of Odia film. At present 66 nos. of applications

are pending at corporation level which are under process and shall be released on approval by Govt. and placement of funds.

3. Recovery of Loans

The corporation has taken all out efforts for realization of the corporation dues by way of personal contact, issue of notices, filing of certificate cases under OPDR Act. In deserving cases, the certificate cases have been transferred to the concerned Districts U/S 12 for execution and attachment of mortgaged properties. Also the corporation undertakes joint drive with the Certificate Courts looking into the requirements and suggestions of the court. Through this process a substantial amount is being realized through courts.

As on 2019-20, a sum of Rs.603.14 lakhs was recovered with interest against the loan amount of Rs.307.00 lakhs. During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021), the corporation has not recovered any amount from any loanees through direct contacts and through Certificate Courts. To expedite the recovery process, the OTS Policy framed is now under active consideration of the Government.

4. Organization of Film Festivals

The corporation has proposed to hold at least 5 Regional Film Festivals in the state at different placed during this financial year through local cultural organizations and concerned district administrations. During 2015-16 (May, 2015) one "International Children's' Film Festival" was held at Balangir with the help of IFFO. Similarly, during 2016-17 (April, 2016), IFFO, Balangir had organized the 2nd "International Children's' Film Festival" and in May, 2016 M/s. Lahari Entertainment, Baragarh had organized a National Level Short Film Utsav in collaboration with the OFDC. An old Odia film festival at Berhampur with the help of Mahendra Kala 'O' Sahitya Sansada was held from 26.11.2016 to 28.11.2016. Besides the above, the 10th "Smruti Chhaya" Odia film festival at Bhubaneswar by Film Journalist Forum (FFF) was held on 08.07.2016 in collaboration with the OFDC and State Culture Department.

During the year 2019-20, NFDC has organized a film festival at Goa during the period from 20.11.2019 to 28.11.2019 wherein four day i.e. from 20.11.2019 to 24.11.2019 was earmarked as Film Bazaar. OFDC and Tourism Department have jointly hired a pavilion in the Film Bazaar to put forth different beautiful, virgin location of the state for attracting different film personalities to avail this along with different incentives as was formulated under the Film Policy. To increase the awareness among the different personalities of the state, U.C.C.C. has nominated eight

members of the state who have also participated in the festival so organized by the Govt. of India. To meet different queries and for better suggestions, OFDC has deputed three persons to participate in the function i.e. Managing Director and Chairman along with the Director, Tourism. The whole aim was to put the virgin locales of our state before the film personnel and to promote film tourism in the state.

During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021) the corporation has not organized any festival.

5. Renovation of Kalinga Studios Ltd.

As decided by the Board, the renovation work of the Kalinga Studios Ltd. has been undertaken in respect of the following works. Accordingly, the OSIC had submitted estimates for Rs.2.13 Cores for construction / renovation / modification of the developmental works.

Repairing of Compound Wall, grading of Green Room (Make-up rooms), renovation of cottages – 04 nos., supply of water to different areas of the studio, repairing of Transformer, construction of pump house as well as overhead tank, repairing of indoor shooting floor, renovation and beautification of lawns and gardens, construction of slums / bastis, pindis and bhagabat tungi etc. inside the studio premises for use by the film makers.

To speed up the work and complete the renovation work early, few works like repair and renovation of black top road, morum road, gate projects – 2 nos. to have more attraction for the studio, construction of decorative cottages and repairing of existing buildings along with new constructions like Railway Station, Bus Stand, Decorative Cottage, Canteen, Jail Room, Petrol Pump etc. for shooting purpose have been entrusted to Works Department.

During the year 2020-21 (January, 2021), the R&B Department has completed the renovation works for pump house, sump, morum road, forest check gate, Editing Block, bath complex and reconstruction of Black Top Road. Construction of the gate project (main gate) is expected to be completed soon. Construction of waiting lounge for gents and ladies, Decorative Cottages and Police Station/Jail are under progress. They have commenced the paver work of the road sides. In the first phase, they have started the paver work in front of Recording Theatre.

Further works like, Canteen, Petrol Pump and Railway Station are in the pipe line. The said works shall be entrusted on approval of the elevation and design etc. Now the Govt. is planning to upgrade the Studio to a world class level in order to facilitate producers of the state as well as to attract outside producers into the state.
