## Introduction

In the fiscal year 2023-24, Odisha continued its trajectory as a leader in sustainable industrial development, building on progressive policy and strategic industrial infrastructure development. The Industries Department of Odisha has focused on attracting significant multi-sectoral investments and fostering an enabling environment for business and innovation.

Odisha's commitment to industrial diversification is reflected in the grounding of projects worth over INR 1.45 lakh crores of projects in diverse sectors such as Metal & Metal Downstream, Chemicals, Textiles, Food processing, Plastics etc. Apart from the grounding of projects, the Government also approved 231 projects worth over Rs 4.98 Lakh crores in the 13 SLSWCA and 5 HLCA meetings held during the year. These proposals are spread across various diverse sectors from Metal & Metal Downstream, Refractory, Textiles, Food Processing, Fertilizers, Chemicals, Petroleum & Petrochemicals, Plastics, Logistics & Infrastructure, Tourism and Manufacturing, Paper, Power, Renewable and Green Energy, IT & ESDM.

This year marked a milestone with the operationalization of major infrastructural projects including Shakti Bhawan and O-Hub. The construction work of several multi-product and sector-specific industrial parks is also progressing smoothly. Some of the notable projects include augmentation of Electronic Manufacturing Cluster in Khordha, Sea Food Park in Deras, Plastic Park in Paradeep, PCPIR in Paradeep, KNIMZ, as well as development of IT Incubation Center in Infocity, IT towers at Mancheswar, Berhampur and Rourkela etc. IDCO is also constructing 13 Workers' Hostel at various potential Industrial Estates of the state under the SIDBI Cluster Development Fund scheme. IDCO has further taken up development of Metal Downstream Parks in Badamal, Jharsuguda and Kalinganagar, Jajpur. These developments will significantly boost the state's manufacturing capacity in the coming years.

The state has made significant strides in enhancing its digital infrastructure, which has streamlined investment processes and regulatory frameworks. The improvements in the GO-SWIFT system have notably reduced procedural times, reinforcing Odisha's position as one of the achiever states for ease of doing business.

On the international front, Odisha has actively engaged with global investors through various platforms, enhancing its profile as a competitive destination for international investors.

The Industries Department is committed to fostering a resilient and thriving industrial landscape in Odisha. With continued focus on ease of doing business, technology integration and best-in-class investment facilitation, the department shall ensure that Odisha becomes the investment destination of choice for domestic and global investors across sectors.

- Under Programme Expenditure, 23 no. of Schemes have been proposed for the Financial Year 2023-24 including 1 new scheme i.e. Grants for District Investment Promotion Agency (DIPA).
- An amount of Rs.703.00 crore has been provided in the BE for 2023-24 under Programme Expenditure which includes an amount of Rs.151.23 lakh towards salaries and administrative cost of 5 Nos. of Special Land Acquisition Cells including 2 Nos of new Special Land Acquisition Cells i.e. 1. Special Land Acquisition Cell, Bhadrak 2. Special Land Acquisition Cell, Kendrapara.
- An amount of Rs.267.5147 crore has been provided in the Supplementary for 2023-24 under Programme Expenditure which includes an amount of Rs.1.47 lakh towards salaries and administrative cost of 2 Nos. of Special Land Acquisition Cells.
- An amount of Rs.720.10 lakh has been provided in the BE-2023-24 under Administrative Expenditure which includes an amount of Rs.48.00 lakh towards Establishment & Strengthening of Odisha Investment and Export Promotion Centre located in the Office of Resident Commissioner, New Delhi (OIEPO).
- An amount of Rs.41.89 lakh has been provided in the Supplementary for 2023-24 under Administrative Expenditure

The major activities of IPICOL, after being declared as SLNA under Odisha Industries Facilitation Act, 2004 are to extend Single Window Facilitation services to investors and to take up Promotional activities for the State.

### **Investment Promotion Outreach Activity**

Industrial Promotion & Investment Corporation of Odisha Ltd (IPICOL) has constantly and consistently increased the visibility of the State in National & International level by participating and organizing events, seminar and workshops across the globe. The brand "Invest Odisha" is being promoted as the best Investment destination through various modes. Make in Odisha is the flagship biennial event organized in Bhubaneswar to showcase the prowess of Industrial ecosystem in the state.

The Government organized the first conclave in 2016 which attract 84 proposals worth Rs. 2.03 lakh cr of Investment. 58 out of those proposals were approved, 38 of those projects are under construction stage and 8 out of those projects have already started production.

The second edition of the conclave was organized in 2018 which attract Rs. 4.23 lakh cr of investment across 17 diversified sectors. 202 investment intents were received during the event and 118 proposals were approved. 88 of those projects have already started construction stage and 19 have already started production.

The third edition of the Make in Odisha Conclave 2022 was a grand success and garner massive investment interest from investors across sectors and geographies. The state has received 741 no of investment intents across 22 diversified sectors and total investment intents received of more than Rs 10 lakh Crore, and employment potential more than 10 lakhs during the Conclave. 480 of these proposals have been approved and 108 projects are in various stage of implementation.

Keeping the Hon'ble Chief Minister's vision of faster conversion of intents to grounding, the Government of Odisha's focus now moves to the grounding of industrial projects.

Apart from the Make in Odisha Conclave following Investment promotion activities were organized during the financial year 2023-24 to attract investment in to the state.

### **Investment Promotion Advisors-**

The thrust of the Government is on environmentally suitable industrialization, which generates maximum employment opportunity and augments State revenue. To achieve this goal, M/s PricewaterhouseCoopers was engaged as the Investment Promotion Advisors for the Focus Sectors. The main objectives of the assignment includes, promotion of Industrial investments into the State through focused Activities in the identified focus sectors and sub-sectors, interact with potential investors, assist in grounding of investment proposals and act as an Investment Advisor to IPICOL. The agency also acts as the knowledge partner in formulating policies and making strategies for attracting investment. In addition to this the agency also provide support for

- a. Assist in development of investment promotion strategy and action plan and their updating from time-to-time
- b. Assist in development of various marketing collaterals and presentations for promoting Odisha as an investment destination
- c. Assist in reaching out to prospective investors to attract investments into the investment regions and industrial clusters being set up by the State
- d. Provide assistance to IPICOL in investor follow-up activities and develop & maintain a dashboard to monitor progress of the investor contact program
- e. Assist IPICOL in organizing investor meets, road shows (national & international), sectoral seminars and participation in other identified national and international events

### **District Investment Promotion Agency-**

To streamline the investment facilitation mechanism at the district level, the State Government has decided to setup **industrial facilitation cells** at district level. The cell will be function under the

guidance of district collector. The cell is called as District Investment Promotion Agency. DIPA has already been operational in all 30 districts operating at the headquarters of Districts. The DIPAs consist of 3 professionals as follow;

- i. Team Leader
- ii. Investment Promotion Expert
- iii. Aftercare and Relationship Expert

### **PR & Social Media Partners-**

IPICOL in support with Industries Department is promoting the Odisha as the preferred investment destination. As part of Investment Promotion activity, IPICOL engaged MSL India Pvt Ltd. as the PR & Social media partner of Invest Odisha. The following activities were carried out by IPICOL during the period.

- a. Organizing Press conferences & interviews of senior journalist,
- b. Disseminate and release news articles on behalf of the Government,
- c. Coverage in national newspapers business websites + vernacular dailies,
- d. Managing Social media platforms and execute campaign in digital platform,
- e. Ensure proper visibility and promotion through print, electronic and social media.

### **Creative Partners-**

To strengthen the “Brand Odisha” IPICOL engaged M/s Lintas India Pvt. Ltd as the creative agency for preparing various promotional materials. The agency provides the creatives/videos in line with the brand manual for promotional use in the print, television, online, outdoor and social media platforms. These creative gave an identity to the state in terms of the preferred investment destination and gateway to the ASEAN region.

### **Other Activities**

**IPICOL was mandated with the following activities.**

- a. ***Making Odisha amongst the top 3 states in India, in terms of grounded projects: -***  
**IPICOL is promoting the State under the brand of Invest Odisha for attracting Investment in to the state. The flagship events like Make in Odisha and other sectoral events were organized to reach out to the investor community. Invest Odisha committed to maintain its pole position. Additionally, IPICOL has been categorized as “Top Performers” amongst 20 State Investment Promotion Agencies (IPAs) with an overall score of 98%, in a recently concluded State IPA ratings report, released by Invest India in collaboration with the World Bank Group. In a latest survey conducted by CMIE capex database & CII Research, Odisha stands 2nd among the top states in India in attracting higher ongoing investments during FY 2022-23. Additionally, a report by RBI, ranks Odisha among the top three states in the country for bank-assisted investment proposals, accounting for 11.8% (₹31,452 crores) of the total project cost sanctioned in 2022-23.**
- b. ***Ensuring overall socio-economic development through industries with 50% value addition to metal: -***  
**Odisha is the mineral hub of the country and largest producer of Aluminium, Steel and Stainless Steel in the country. Odisha**

aims to add value to these base metals by promoting downstream industries in these sectors. A vision document has been prepared which guide the state to achieve 50% value addition to its base metal products by 2030. These downstream industries will generate employment and revenue for the state and will help in socio-economic development of local community.

- c. **Comprehensive end-to-end single-window clearance for industries:** - The single window clearance system of Odisha (GO SWIFT) is one of its kind in the country and it create a benchmark for others for adapt. The GO SWIFT was awarded with silver medal at the National e-governance Award for 2019-20 under category-1 'Excellence in Government Process Re-engineering for Digital Transformation' by the e-Governance division of the Centre. The single window provides one stop solution for the investors. Integration with other services is in progress. The prototype is completed. The GOSWIFT 2.0 provides 54 services from 18 Departments.
- d. **Professionalism at IPICOL:** - District Investment Promotion Agency (DIPA) at the district level is a significant initiative undertaken by the State Government to streamline the investment facilitation mechanism. The primary objective of establishing DIPA is to create a dedicated and efficient investment facilitation unit that will operate under the guidance of District Collector. These cells will act as catalysts for investment promotion and enhancing the overall investment climate within the region.
- e. **Promoting 'New Age' Economy Technologies in the State:** - New Age industries like Advanced Cell Chemistry Batteries, Bio-technology & Electric mobility is being encouraged by dedicated policy and infrastructure support.

### **Minimizing Regulatory Compliance Burden (MRCB)**

With increasing focus on providing an enabling and conducive environment for businesses and enterprises in the country, the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) has undertaken multiple initiatives to reduce regulatory compliance burdens that affect businesses in terms of time and cost. Under this program, DPIIT is collaborating with various Central Government Ministries and State Governments to simplify and streamline processes, rationalize penal provisions, develop digital platforms, expedite license issuance and renewals, introduce self-certification and third-party verification mechanisms and in turn reduce overall cost of doing business in the country.

Minimizing Regulatory Compliance Burden (MRCB) exercise was launched in 2020 with the goal of improving the Ease of Doing Business and Ease of Living for citizens by reducing regulatory compliances for both Government to Business (G2B) and Government to Citizen (G2C) services. In the first cycle of MRCB, Odisha achieved a significant reduction in the compliance burden, addressing more than 1500 compliances that impacted both businesses and citizens. The commitment continued subsequent cycles in 2021 and 2022 with the identification and resolution of an additional 263 burdensome compliances. With additional initiatives being included under MRCB from 2023, the focus has now shifted toward decriminalizing penal provisions, with 113 Acts under scrutiny across 14 departments. Efforts are also underway to amend the Labor Code, further eliminating burdensome penal provisions.

It has been observed that there are many archaic laws still in statute books across states. These laws have provisions wherein the severity of punishment is not commensurate with the nature of offense. Also, we have an overburdened criminal justice system. Keeping all this in mind, DPIIT has

prioritized “Decriminalization” under the recent phase of MRCB. Some of the key action that needs to be taken include:

- a. Removal of unnecessary criminal provisions to remove avenues of rent seeking/corruption
- b. Bifurcation of minor offenses from serious contraventions affecting public interest, National security
  - Converting imprisonment to civil penalty
  - Compounding of offenses
  - “First-time” v/s “Repeated offenses”
- c. Retention of imprisonment provisions, wherever deemed fit.

Further, with the standard framework for evaluation of Cost of Doing Business being developed by DPIIT, the state will be able to calculate and compare the overall cost of doing business with other Indian States, which will result in identification of specific G2B services which need to be improved.

These comprehensive measures aim to reduce regulatory burdens, particularly in areas such as issuance of licenses, certifications, approvals, permissions, renewals, inspections, elimination of outdated laws, and decriminalization of minor offenses.

### **Ease of Doing Business (EoDB)**

DPIIT, in coordination with States and Union Territories (UTs), has undertaken a series of reforms to improve the business climate in the country. Starting with a 98-point Reform action Plan in 2014, successive State Reforms Action Plans have been released by DPIIT covering more areas of reform. The objective of the Action Plan is to layout the series of reforms targeted at increasing transparency and improving the efficiency and effectiveness of regulatory framework and services for businesses in India. The Action Plan for the year 2022 consisted of 352 Reform points spread across business-centric and citizen-centric reforms pertaining to 15 Odisha State Government Departments

Since the start of the Ease of Doing Business Reforms / Business Reform Action Plan in 2014, Odisha has taken several measures to significantly improve the ease of doing business environment in the state. While the state implemented 52.12% of the reforms in the first cycle in 2015, it improved significantly in 2016 implementing over 92% reforms. In the next three exercise in 2017, 2019 and 2020, the state has implemented over 95% of the reforms suggested by DPIIT, Government of India. In the recently concluded BRAP 2022 cycle, the state has achieved an outstanding feat of implementing almost 99% of the suggested reforms.

The key reform areas include development of a state single window system for all the investments coming to the state, development of an online building permission system, digitization of land records, reforms on property registration and Inspection Reforms which included synchronized randomized risk-based inspection of industrial units.

Along with these, various reforms pertaining to utilities including electricity and water connection for industrial units, reforms pertaining to consent to establish and consent to operate as well as reforms pertaining to various labour laws have been implemented.

The Government of Odisha is committed to ensuring implementation all the reforms under ease of doing business plan in letter and spirit. The Government of Odisha has also implemented various other reforms apart from the ones suggested under EoDB framework to ensure a robust and attractive industrial ecosystem in the state.

#### **CSR framework towards institutionalization of CSR actives in Odisha FY 2023-2024**

- a. A web-portal called Government of Odisha – CSR Administration and Responsive Engagement (GO CARE) was subsequently created to provide all key information on the CSR activities in the State. The portal contains all CSR projects, undertaken, ongoing and upcoming in the State, thereby acting as a one stop shop for all CSR activities in the State. District level and block level HDIs collected from various welfare department updated in the GOCARE portal for better corporate decision while selecting CSR initiatives.
- b. For the year 2014-24, 10210 projects of amount 4018.38 Cr has been reported on the GOCARE portal.

#### **Awards & Recognitions**

- b. **IPICOL** has been categorized as a **top performer** among 20 state investment promotion agencies with an overall score of **98 per cent**. The assessment by **Invest India in collaboration with the World Bank Group** was meant to measure the preparedness of Indian investment promotion agencies to attract and facilitate investment projects.
- c. Odisha has been recognized as an **Achiever** in the **Ease of Doing Business** rankings released by DPIIT, Government of India in 2022.
- d. **GO-SMILE (Government of Odisha – Synchronized Mechanism for Inspection of Licensed Enterprises)** has been identified as a **Best Practice** under Ease of Doing Business by DPIIT, Government of India.
- e. Government of Odisha’s GIS based portal **GO-PLUS (Government of Odisha – Portal for Land Use and Services)** has bagged the **Geospatial Application Excellence Award 2017** at the **Geospatial World Forum 2017** held at Hyderabad on 25<sup>th</sup> January 2017.
- f. In a report for the FY 2022-23 published released by **CMIE Capex database & CII research**, Odisha has been ranked 2nd in terms of attracting investment in to the state for FY 2022-23
- g. In a report for the FY 2022-23 published by **RBI**, Odisha is placed at 3rd in terms of value of projects financed by banks

To ensure a hassle-free business environment to investors, a number of reforms along with a number of technological interventions have been carried out by various Departments of the State Government in the recent past. As a part of ease of doing business in the State, the following technological platform have been developed.

- i. **GOSWIFT:**

The flagship single window portal of Industries Department i.e. “GO SWIFT”, developed and maintained by IPICOL has received more than 4000 PEAL applications till date for various sectors for implementation of project along with the establishment of industries. Similarly, more than 18,000 service applications pertaining to different Govt. Departments for getting clearances for pre-establishment and post establishment of activities of industry. As per BRAP 2022, GO SWIFT portal is integrated with five new services of OSPCB to facilitate investors to submit their application.

The portal has been successfully integrated with National Single Window System (NSWS Portal) in the first phase. Odisha is one of the states chosen to roll out the integration in the first phase of launching of portal by DPIIT. Similarly reverse integration of GO SWIFT portal with National Single Window System has been integrated using SAML and Key Cloak mechanism which is going to be Go Live shortly by DPIIT.

In the ongoing activity, a new module named as Grievance Redressal module has been developed to address grievance of user. Similarly, revamp of GO SWIFTV2.0 with new features has been developed to facilitate user. In the new version as submission of pre-establishment and post establishment applications at one go along with trickle feed mechanism of payment has been introduced for end users. The portal has received award under the Silver Category from National e-Governance under the Dept. of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances. Similarly, the portal was accoladed with silver award for GO SWIFT in the year 2023. The portal is on revamp align with new IPR (Industrial Policy Resolution) 2022 to facilitate investors.

ii. **SLFC**

To facilitate ease of doing business in Odisha and expedite the grounding of projects, the State has taken various initiatives such as creation of the State Level Facilitation Cell (SLFC) at IPICOL where senior officials from departments of Energy, Water, OSPCB, Factories & Boilers and IDCO are deputed on a full-time basis with delegation of appropriate authority to process industrial approvals. The SLFC, which meets every week, has had 255 meetings till date since its inception in 2015.

Since April, 2023 SLFC has approved/ recommended a total 231 projects worth INR 4,97,912.53 crores with employment potential of about 331,336 nos. and issues pertaining to about 28 industrial projects have been resolved.

iii. **SLSWCA and HLCA**

Since April, 2023 thirteen (13) meetings of State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLSWCA) have been held to approve project proposals. One hundred and eighty-six (186) Nos. of project proposals have been cleared by State Level Single Window Clearance Authority (SLWCA) aggregating proposed investment of Rs. 38,101.20 Crores. Besides forty-five (45) nos of project proposals have been cleared by five (5) High Level Clearance Authority (HLCA) meetings aggregating proposed investment of Rs. 4,59,811.33 Crores.

These proposals are spread across various diverse sectors from Metal & Metal Downstream, Refractory, Textiles, Food Processing, Fertilizers, Chemicals, Petroleum & Petrochemicals, Plastics, Logistics & Infrastructure, Tourism and Manufacturing, Paper, Power, Renewable and Green Energy, IT & ESDM.

**Annual Activities Report 2023-24**

**The Organization**

Odisha Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (IDCO) was set up by the Government of Odisha as a statutory Corporation in 1981. IDCO has been acting as the Nodal Agency for providing industrial infrastructure and land for industrial and infrastructure projects in the State.

**The Objective & Functions:**

The objective of the Corporation is to provide infrastructure services for rapid establishment and orderly growth of industry, trade and commerce in Odisha. Its core functions are broadly as follows:

- Development of industrial estates, industrial areas, IT Parks and other industrial complexes.  
Land Acquisition services for major & mega projects and creation of Land bank.
- Development of Infrastructure facilities and facilitation of private-sector participation
- Project Construction services

**Developments of Industrial Estates/Parks/Areas**

Facilitating industrial investments by way of providing ready-to-use infrastructure is its core business. To this pursuit, a large number of industrial estates/ areas/ Parks, Theme Parks, etc. have been established and managed by the Corporation in different strategic locations of the state. Developed plots and built-up sheds are allotted to entrepreneurs intending to set-up their industrial ventures at attractive rates. Such projects include:

- 128 industrial estates/areas in strategic locations of Odisha with an area of Ac. 12127.854 land and 1542 nos. built up sheds.
- Out of the above land, around Ac. 7178.33 land and 1503 nos built up sheds has been allotted to 6789 nos different Industrial Units in different Industrial Estates. During this year (as on 31.03.2024), 97 nos small & medium units have been allotted around Ac. 229.392 of land in different Industrial Estates/Areas.
- Establishment/development of 30 (Thirty) Multi-Product MSME Park in the state. Out of which, 18 nos MSME Park at Ramdaspur in Cuttack district (Ac.55.63), Chhatabar in Khurda district (Ac.56.98), Talamulasasan in Angul district (Ac.53.02), Basantpur in Sambalpur district (Ac.50.00), Reuna in Sundargarh district (Ac.51.00), Kesinga in Kalahandi district (Ac.47.69), Barapali, Hinjili in Ganjam district (Ac.31), Bamani in Nawarangpur district (Ac.57.50), Gandhigran in Boudh district(Ac.46.98), Rairangpur in Mayurbhanj

district(Ac.53.00), Titiberu in Malkanagiri district(Ac.86.00), Komna in Nuapada district(Ac.49.50), Dambosara in Rayagada district(Ac.105.00), Tareikela in Subarnpur district (Ac.44.91), Nirakarpur in Nayagarh district (Ac.117.00), Panchapada in Jharsuguda district (Ac.91.50) and Sadeipali(Growth centre) Bolangir district (Ac.39.00) are in progress. Balance 12(Twelve) nos MSME Parks in Balasore, Bargarh, Bhadrak, Deogarh, Dhenkanal, Gajapati, Jagatsinghpur, Kandhamal, Keonjhar, Koraput & Puri district land acquisition work is in progress.

#### **Infrastructure projects under implementation:**

##### **1. Electronic Manufacturing Cluster (EMC):**

An electronic hardware manufacturing cluster is being developed at Info valley over an area of 203.37 acres of land with a Project Cost of Rs. 200.75 crore. IDCO has allotted Ac. 60.465 of land to 10 Units which includes Ac. 18.37 of land allotted to RBI and Ac.10 allotted to M/s Adani. One unit is operational.

##### **2. Plastic Park at Paradeep:**

A Plastic Park has been established over an area of Ac.120 land in PCPIR near IOCL Refinery Complex under the Plastic park scheme of Department of Chemicals & Petrochemicals, Government of India with an investment of Rs 106 Crores. The project is at advance stage of completion. Twenty units have been allotted Ac. 37.00 of land in the Park. One unit M/s Tidal Trading shall be commissioned shortly.

##### **3. Seafood Park, Deras:**

A Seafood Park at Deras has been established over an area of 152.78 acres of land. 17 units have been allotted Ac.46.19 of land in the Park. One unit is operational and four units are under implementation.

##### **4. Petroleum, Chemical and Petrochemical Investment Region (PCPIR):**

Under the PCPIR Scheme of Govt. of India, the State govt. is developing a PCPIR at Paradeep to be set up on 284.15 sq km (70,214 acres) of land spread over Jagatsinghpur and Kendrapada districts. Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOCL) is the anchor tenant for the project. Master Plan and public consultation in Jagatsinghpur & Kendrapada district completed. Indian Oil Corporation Ltd (IOCL) has been allotted Ac.3342.310 land. Public hearing in Jagatsinghpur & Kendrapada district is completed for EC.

##### **5. Kalinganagar National Investment Manufacturing Zone(KNIMZ):**

The Steel Complex at Kalinganagar established over an area of 13000 acres of land where 9 Major Steel Companies has already set-up their units and producing 3.5 Million tonnes of steel per annum and has generated 40000 employments. Government of Odisha is planning to develop this complex as National Investment Manufacturing Zone under the National Manufacturing Policy of Government of India. IDCO is the Nodal Agency for implementation of the scheme. Master plan of KNIMZ to be notified soon.

##### **6. Construction of IT Incubation Centre:**

An IT Incubation Centre is being developed in the Infocity IT/ITES SEZ, Chandaka, Bhubaneswar over an area of 2.39 acres of land with a built up area 33048sqm. Hon'ble Chief Minister has inaugurated Tower-A for MSME startup on 18.12.2021. State Govt has approved outright purchase of entire O-Hub (Tower- A & B) by MSME deptt for startup. Hon'ble Chief Minister has inaugurated Development centre of IBM on 16.10.2022.

**7. IT Tower and MLCP :**

IDCO has taken up initiatives for construction of IT towers at Mancheswar, Berhampur and Rourkela . Also taken initiatives for construction of Multi Level Car Parking(MLCP) at Infocity, Bhubaneswar.

**8. Textile Park at Dhamnagar**

IDCO has contemplated to establish a Technical Textile Park over 234 acres of land available near Dhamnagar in Bhadrak district. Ac.58.625 of land allotted to IOCL for setting up of Technical Textile Park. External Water Supply and internal infrastructure development works in progress.

**9. Up-gradation of Existing Industrial Estates:**

IDCO has taken initiatives for comprehensive up-gradation of two existing Industrial Estates at Angul and Sambalpur and also taken up expansion of two Industrial Estates such as Indranipatna and Choudwar under SCDF programme.

**10. MSE-CDP Scheme under Ministry of MSME, Govt. of India:**

IDCO has received 6 nos of DPR approval from Ministry of MSME, Govt of India for up-gradation of industrial estates such as Jagatpur(Cuttack district), Angargadia (Balasore district), Paradeep (Jagatsinghpur district), Chandaka (Khurda district), Auto nagar(Ganjam district) and Kalunga(Sundargarh district). IDCO has deposited equity of Rs. 9.90 Cr. as 1st installment; similarly, GoI has released Rs. 12 Cr. as 1st installment. Work in progress in all the 06 nos. of Industrial Estates and nearing completion.

**11. Workers' Hostel approved under SIDBI Cluster Development Fund (SCDF) :**

For facilitation of stay of industrial workers, IDCO is constructing 13 nos of Workers' Hostel at various potential Industrial Estates of the state. These projects have been taken up under SCDF scheme.

**12. Development Industrial Cluster**

IDCO has taken up development of Industrial Cluster in 3 (Three) locations with total project cost of 221.29 Cr for 03 Years (FY 2021-2024) out of which 60 Cr was sanctioned and released from state government grant in FY 2021-22 by Industries Deptt. The location such as i) Dhamnagar (Bhadrak) (Ac 170.12) - 92.95 Cr, ii) Begunia (Khorda) (Ac 129.00) – 76.55 Cr and iii) Golamunda (Kalahandi) (Ac 100.00) – 51.70 Cr. Infrastructure development works are in progress.

**13. Development of Metal Downstream Parks:**

IDCO has taken up development of Metal Downstream Parks in Badamal (Jharsuguda) (Ac 126.06) – 74.75 Cr and Kalinganagar (Jajpur) (Ac 100.00) – 69.75 Cr with total project cost of 144.50 Cr for 03 Years (FY 2021-2024) out of which 50 Cr was sanctioned and released from state government grant in FY 2021-22 by Industries Deptt. Preparation of DPR for development of Infrastructure in phases has been initiated.

**14. Development of Odisha Economic Corridor (East Coast Economic Corridor)**

State Government extend gross financial assistance of Rs. 3000 Crore (from the period 2021-22 to 2023-24) through budgetary provision under “Financial Assistance for development of East Coast Economic Corridor” to develop two nodes mainly Gopalpur – Bhubaneswar – Kalinganagar (GBK) and Paradeep – Kendrapada – Dhamra – Subarnarekha (PKDS) for industrial infrastructure development in the Odisha leg of East Coast Economic Corridor, i.e., Odisha Economic Corridor. In the meantime, State Government grant of 20 Cr

was released against the Odisha Economic Corridor Project for which land acquisition is under progress.

**15. Biju Economic Corridor(BEC) Industrial Corridor Across Biju Express Way:**

The Biju Economic Corridor (BEC) extending from Rourkela (Biramitrapur) to Malakanagiri(Motu) covering 10 districts such as Sundargarh, Jharsuguda, Sambalpur, Bargarh, Sonepur, Kalahandi, Nuapada, Nawarangpur, Koraput & Malkanagiri districts. Industries Department, Govt of Odisha shall notify key industrial regions along BEC as “Designated Industrial Area” on the recommendation of IDCO. Special focus has given to districts like Kalahandi, Nuapada, Nabarangpur, Koraput & Malkanagiri. IDCO has identified land in the above 10 districts for development of Industrial Estates/Areas/Parks along BEC and acquisition / alienation is in progress.

**16. Mega Aluminium Park at Angul:**

The Aluminium Park at Angul is being developed by M/s Angul Aluminium Park Pvt Ltd., an SPV formed by IDCO & NALCO. The Park has been completed. Since, more than 50% of allocable land has already been allotted to intending units, therefore, the State Govt. has proposed for expansion of the Park over an area of 500 acres of land excluding the existing 223 acres of land under development. The downstream and ancillary industries expected to come – up there, can use the common facilities available in the existing Aluminium Park.

**17. Construction work:**

IDCO also provides comprehensive project construction and management services for execution of civil, electrical and public health engineering projects in social sectors. Over the years, it has successfully executed Civil, Public Health Engineering and Electrical Engineering works entrusted by Government Department, PSUs and Govt. of India. Some of the major works executed by IDCO during the last five years both completed and ongoing are as follows:

**Land Acquisition:**

IDCO is the nodal agency for acquiring and providing land to large Industries coming up in the State. Large-scale land acquisition is going on at strategic locations for establishment of medium/large projects. So far, over Ac.73257.138 (Govt.-Ac.26344.571 + Private- Ac.46912.567) land has been allotted to both MOU/Non-MOU Industries in the state. The allottees include projects under Steel, Aluminum, Ferro Alloys, Cement, Power sectors etc.

**Land Bank:**

IDCO is the Nodal Agency for creation of 'Land Bank' under the Land Bank scheme. IDCO has filed requisition with district authorities for alienation of Ac. 204984.610 of land covering 30 districts. An extent of land sanctioned under Category-A is Ac.22734.806 and reserved under Category – B is Ac. 51364.654 has been reserved. The total land available under the Land Bank scheme is Ac. 74099.460.

**Financial achievement:**

The turnover achieved by the Corporation is Rs. 1195.32 crore (Provisional) during 2023-24 against the MOU target of Rs. 950 crores for 2023-24.

## **THE ODISHA FILM DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION LTD.**

### **Annual Activities Report 2023-2024**

#### **1. Odia Film Archive: -**

The OFDC Ltd. has set up an Odia Film Archive in the corporate office of the corporation at Cuttack for preserving the cinematic heritage of Odisha. The films which have been collected/obtained from various sources are being re-edited and transferred to LTO Tapes for preserving the same for the posterity. For such transfer into the LTO Tapes, LTO Archival Equipment's have been installed at the said archives to preserve the cinematic heritage of Odia film, documenting the film history of Odisha and for providing resources for research and education. This archive will preserve films, ensuring their longevity and accessibility for future generation.

#### **2. Preview Theatre: -**

The renovation of the existing preview theatre present at Chalachitra Bhawan, Buxi Bazar, Cuttack has been made. The newly renovated preview theatre contains Galalite Projection Screen 2.4 gain, WUXGA Laser Projector, Dolby Atmos 7.1. Surround sound system, 30 sheeted premium pushback theatre chair with cushion arm & cup holder, Fully Digital format screening, air conditioned waiting lounge for its visitors which is well equipped to conduct film trade exhibitions, seminars, and film screening facilities. The screening of the films here made for viewing of the esteemed jury members for the selection of awardees for excellence in different categories of Odia films by the Department of Odia Language, Literature and Culture, Government of Odisha. The Central Board of Film Certification under the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India also certify films by screening films of different language in the preview theatre. For such Film Certification screening by CBFC, the preview theatre is given on rent to the film producers at regular basis.

#### **3. Implementation of Odisha State Film Policy 2019: -**

OFDC as a nodal agency of the government to facilitate development of the film industry by following appropriate framework of policy and infrastructure. Odisha intends to be a leader in the development of the sector, by creating a conducive ecosystem for production of films in the state. The development of this sector will not only help in the growth of Odisha's economy but also act as an important medium to boost tourism through promotion of State's rich cultural heritage, history, architecture, tourist destinations and varied ethnicity. The Odisha State Film Policy 2019 aims at facilitating development of the sector by providing accommodation to the film makers at different destination at subsidized prices.

The key objectives of Odisha State Film Policy 2019 are:

- a. To promote quality Odia films
- b. To facilitate film tourism in the State
- c. To establish Odisha as a destination for film shooting
- d. To improve screen density in Odisha

To achieve the above objectives following financial benefits are being provided under the Odisha State Film Policy such as –

**A. Capital Subsidy to film makers to Shoot in Odisha: -**

A subsidy of 25% of the total cost of the film is being provided as per the provisions of the film policy of the govt for English/ Hindi/ International/ other language films which 'promote Odisha, its culture, heritage, tourist destinations etc. Odisha Tourism Development Corporation (OTDC) properties, Government Guest Houses, Forest Guest Houses, Circuit Houses, etc. are being provided at the prevailing official rates to the film makers shooting in Odisha and 75% of actual expenditure in accommodation at OTDC properties for the purpose are being reimbursed, subject to a ceiling of INR 10 lakh. The facility has been provided to 5 number of beneficiaries.

**B. Capital Investment Subsidy:**

Capital investment subsidy is being provided to eligible cinema halls and multiplex projects, at the rate of 20% of the investment, subject to a ceiling of INR 4 crore. The facility has been availed by 2 number of cinema halls.

**C. Reimbursement of SGST**

New projects as per the provision of the policy are eligible for reimbursement of 100% of net SGST for a period of 7 years from the date of commercial operation limited to 200% of cost of plant & machinery or 100% of the project cost, whichever is low in a tapered manner. The benefits under the said policy have been availed by 4 number of beneficiaries.

**D. Scholarship to Students: -**

To facilitate quality training of the youth in the field of film production, a onetime scholarship of Rs. 25,000/- is being provided to the students having Odisha domicile status undergoing training and pursuing education at FTII, Pune and at SRFTI, Kolkata and top five students on merit basis enrolled in each course at BPFTIO, Cuttack, Odisha on admission. The corporation granted the scholarship of Rs. 25,000/- amounting to Rs. 5.75 Lakhs in toto 23 students in FY 2023-24.

**E. Re-Development of Kalinga Studio's: -**

With the sole objective of re-building Kalinga Studio to a world class level, the government announced the project and sanctioned a sum of Rs.200 crores. Several infrastructures like Village Complex, Indoor Shooting Floor, Tech Zone, Entrance Plaza, Movie Magic, Adventure Land and Snow World, Iconic Structure, Auditoriums and Pond etc. are under construction and the project is scheduled to be inaugurate by April 2024

**4. Website & Revamp of Website to Web-Portal: -**

In 2019, the website of the OFDC has been designed and inaugurated by the honorable Chief Minister of Odisha. It was designed for establishing credibility, fostering connections and promoting the corporation's contributions to the realm of film development in Odisha. The website facilitates effective communication, allowing corporation to share news, updates and contact information. Efforts are being taken to revamp the existing website into a web portal to make it broader and user friendly which will act as the marketing tool, attracting more audience and enhancing the visibility of the Odia film industry. Furthermore, the upcoming web portal will be a single window to obtain several services from OFDC like availing e-booking of preview theatre etc., permission for shooting at Kalinga Studio etc. and applying for several incentives available under Odisha State Film Policy 2019.

5. **Proposal for construction of a multiplex by the OFDC**

The management of the OFDC has decided for construction of a Multiplex to be fully owned by OFDC inside it office complex having the following facilities:

1. Triple Screen Multiplex with one dedicated screen exclusively for Odia Films in order to address the release of Odia films due to the want of theatre in the state.
2. Food Court for the refreshment of the visitors.
3. Banquet Hall for Press Meet & Other film related activities.

6. **Organizing State Film Award 2019**

In collaboration with the department of Odia Language, Literature and Culture, Government of Odisha, the corporation has got the Odia films screened by the esteemed jury for selection of awardees in different categories of Odia Cinema for the year 2020, 2021, 2022 in order to hold the Odisha State Film Awards for excellence in the different categories of Odia Films.

7. **Participation in 1<sup>st</sup> World Odia Language Conference, 2024**

The First World Odia Language Conference by the Government of Odisha was held at Janata Maidan, Bhubaneswar. The exhibition ground was declared as temporary museum where OFDC Ltd. exhibited the vintage cine equipment's and rare film posters along with the Odia Cine Magazine Covers. The second odia film 'Lalita' was also exhibited and a special documentary on 'Literature to Cinema' conceptualized and compiled under the aegis of OFDC was exhibited to the public.
